Reading: This past week, we continued reading in our Book Club Book. Please inquire about your child's book and interpretations of the book so far! We had lessons on how to share ideas with other readers, how to reference the text and use text evidence to support one's interpretations and ideas, and what techniques powerful and skilled narrative authors use when writing fiction books! Please continue to encourage your child to read at home! I love hearing what they are reading about! Need ideas...let me know!

Science: This past week we had lessons on how plants gain weight and grow. Ask your student about the lab with the balloons and their new understandings. We also had

lessons on decomposers. We learned about the role fungi play in decomposing dead materials and in soil.
